Additionally, it has a 201-bed nursing home, two foundations, and various other notfor-profit and for-profit businesses and joint ventures.

LifeBridge is recognized as a 2021 High Performing organization by The Association for Healthcare Philanthropy (AHP) accounting for the top 25% of all reporting health system fundraising programs. Julie's area of expertise is building comprehensive development programs with an emphasis on transformational gifts in collaboration with the executive team, board members, and physicians.

Under Julie's direction, LifeBridge Health completed the system's first system wide "Building Bridges" Campaign totaling \$125M. In fiscal year 2021, LifeBridge's strategic initiatives received \$30.2M in private and government including capital, technology, and research. Of the \$17.5M raised in private support in 2021, a total of \$3.5M (20%) was received directly from, or through, the efforts of Board members across the health system.

Julie received her Certified Fund Raising Executive (CFRE) in 1997 and her Fellow of the Association for Healthcare Philanthropy (FAHP) in 2012, which is the highest certification possible in the healthcare development profession. She currently serves on the Association for Healthcare Philanthropy (AHP) Board of Directors and is proud to support the Development profession through a strong commitment to leadership, advocacy, and teaching.
